Like a scene out of a sciencefiction movie, white-coated

figures in a dark room intently follow data projected on a semi-circular wall of screens flanking a patient prone on an operating room table.

Some monitor

the patient's vital signs, while others follow the surgeon's movements as he uses

sophisticated imaging tools to guide a surgical tool through the patient's nostril, in order to excise a tumor in her neck.

This state-of-the-art control system installed in the recently opened Head and Neck Operating Room at Rambam Health Care Campus is the first of its kind in the world, made possible through a donation by a group of business leaders who prefer to remain anonymous.

"This system was built to meet our particular specifications" explains Professor Ziv Gil, Director of the Department of Otorhinolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery at Rambam. "It enables all of the operating room's systems to be adjusted and coordinated by the surgical team according to the needs of the patient and the type of intervention."

At the end of July, Rambam's mandate to care for Israel's remaining holocaust survivors was affirmed during an emotional ceremony in the hospital's modern, new Joseph Fishman Oncology Center. Ribbons were cut to celebrate the opening of the new Radiotherapy Inpatient Department and Chemotherapy Inpatient Department. Both were built and equipped thanks to a generous donation from the Conference on Jewish Material Claims against Germany, also known as the Claims Conference.

Representing the Claims Conference, Mr. Yaron Marcus and Mr. Avi Rosenthal accepted Rambam's Golden Maimonides Circle Award, presented by Professor Ron Appelbaum, Director of the Joseph Fishman Oncology Center, and Dr. Esty Golan, Managing Director of International Relations and Chief of Strategic Development.

Over the years, the Claims
Conference has supported
Rambam with millions of dollars
in donations, specifically targeted
to upgrade and refurbish those
departments that serve Israel's
aging population and the
Holocaust survivors within it.
Thus, along with the new
Oncology hospitalization facilities,
the Claims Conference has been
instrumental in supporting
renovations in the Departments
of Neurology, Urology, Ear, Nose
and Throat, General Surgery,
